

FY2016 Ranking rationale:

- 1) We considered the following objective data in developing the score order of projects based on the following:
 - a. Project Evaluation and Scoring sheet
 - b. 3 year historical project performance HMIS evaluation
 - c. HUD recaptured fund report
 - d. Project Application information
- 2) Coordinated Entry and HMIS projects were ranked at the top of the priority list due to FY 2016 HHR GB priority for increased funds for these activities
- 3) New projects with HUD and HHR GB priority were ranked into Tier I with reallocated funds
- 4) Newly renewing project applicants were held harmless and were ranked into Tier 1
- 5) All other renewal projects were ranked by score from the Project Evaluation and Scoring sheet
- 6) Following this rank by score process, 2 renewal projects scored into Tier 2
- 7) Although Teresa Living Center scored lower than Hearth Connection, the Ranking committee recommended to rank Teresa Living Center into Tier 1 for the following reasons:
 - a. Hearth Connections renewal project fund amount was significantly higher than this small renewal project.
 - b. Over the past years, Hearth Connection repeatedly left significant funds in their overall grant, which were recaptured by HUD.
 - c. Although the Theresa Living Center's total score was lower than Hearth Connections, the project performed exceptionally well over all the performance indicators.
